

2016 Community Forum

The first annual Community Forum, held at the Prague Impact HUB in May 2016, brought together over 100 people, including community leaders and NGO staff from the Czech Republic and abroad. The event focused on functioning communities. We were interested in learning what we could do to help communities better use their local resources, facilitate connections between residents and grow people's sense of well-being in their given communities.

Participants engaged in presentations, practical workshops, open space discussions and site visits to community initiatives in Prague. Speakers included urban planner Elena Madison of the NYC-based organization Project for Public Spaces and Alina Porumb, program director of the Romanian foundation ARC.

When we fail to see beyond our own bubble, we run the risk of becoming isolated and not understanding other people – and this can lead to divisions in local communities, as we often see in the CEE region. Based on our analysis of needs and challenges in the communities with which we work, we are focusing our 2017 Community Forum on the issue of polarized communities.

Aiming to explore ways to initiate dialogue between polarized groups within communities, the event will bring together people working on various levels in local communities in the Czech Republic and other European countries with the overall goal of enabling them to glean inspiration from different countries, share their best practices and approaches and support one another's efforts. Over three days, *Community Forum: Breaking Out of Bubbles* will offer key note speakers, a set of workshops, open space discussions, site visits and networking activities.
