Today marks the 28th anniversary of the Czech Republic's Velvet Revolution. Even as we commemorate the end of totalitarianism in our country, we are reminded by current events worldwide that democracy needs to be continually nurtured. We believe that a key element in a strong democracy is citizen engagement in local communities - which has been at the core of our work since our founding in 1997.

Yes, this year Via Foundation turned 20! We took a look at what that means in numbers:

4,331

supported projects

CZK 320,000,000 (\$13 million)

Awarded in grants

CZK 130,000,000 (\$5 million)

Invested in education and development

CZK 95,000,000 (\$3,950,000)

In online gifts through Darujme.cz

That's right - we provided funding to **4,331** community, philanthropy and development initiatives in the Czech Republic and other Central and Eastern Europe countries in a total amount of **CZK 320 million (\$13 million)**.

We invested another CZK **130 million (\$5 million)** into the education and development of people working in non-profit organizations and social enterprises and development of philanthropy among children and young people. In tandem with this funding we provided thousands of hours of inspiration, consultations, mentoring and customized training.

Last but definitely not least, we helped Czech non-profit organizations raise CZK 95 million (\$3,950,000) in online gifts through the Darujme.cz online giving portal.
